**OBITUARY:** Clyde Wright, 73, died Sunday at the Lamert Hospital after a long illness. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the Martin-Azbell Funeral Home. The Rev. Harry Clifton officiated. Burial was in the Princeton Cemetery.
