#### Introduction

[From the author: Any name contained herein which appears in an underscored blue font is a hyperlink to a corresponding Find a Grave memorial. Any title appearing in an underscored blue font is a hyperlink to its corresponding website.]

According to the <u>United States Census,1900</u>, <u>Effie</u> and <u>Albert "Dunn" Hamilton</u> are recorded as married while residing in Trail Creek Township, Mt. Moriah vill., Harrison County, Missouri. Effie's age at this time is 15 with Albert's at 30. This census indicates that she was 15 in their marriage year. Therefore, they appear to be married after her 15<sup>th</sup> birthday of June 9, 1900. Since their daughter <u>Esta</u> was born on November 12, 1900, without ever mentioning that she was of a premature birth and Effie passing away the following January 23, 1901, due to complications of childbirth, to me, this raises new questions of when exactly Albert [a.k.a. "Dunn" and "A.D."] and Effie were married; else, was she with child when they married? Recorded within this census is: Married – 0 years; living children - 0; and mother of how many children - 0. Esta stated her mother was 15 when she married, bore Esta, and at death.

Now, per the *Family Tree Magazine* in the online article *Official Dates for US Censuses*,

The date a census taker wrote on his form isn't as important as the official census date: Enumerators were supposed to list individuals' ages as of a date specified by the Census Bureau. Jan. 1 was "Census Day" for the 1920 enumeration, so someone born Feb. 12, 1909, should be recorded as 10 on the census form-even if the census taker visited in April. This magic date varied, so use this chart to sort out ancestors' reported ages.

June 1, 1900, is the official census date for the year of 1900. Consequently, depending on when a census taker visited the Hamilton household, Effie may have actually been married before her June 9, 1900,15<sup>th</sup> birthday. Research continues to clarity this issue. ~*Kathy Wright-Wainer* 

Although family members were nearby, Albert found caring for Esta and the farm as a single parent too difficult. In a family made decision, he allowed Effie's mother, <u>Eunice Louise</u> [maiden name of Brown and widow of <u>Joseph M. Davis</u>] and step-father, <u>Emery Edgar Johnson</u>, to raise Esta along with Eunice and Emery's daughter <u>Eva E</u>. (born on August 28, 1898). They also <u>resided</u> in Trail Creek Township, Mt. Moriah of Harrison County, Missouri. *Author's note:* <u>Maudie Davis-Power</u> is the first born child of Eunice and Joseph Davis and married Sylvester Power. Effie was their second child.

Albert together with other Hamilton family members did not abandon Esta and kept in regular contact with her through the writing of cards and letters as well as frequent visits. For several years, Albert remained nearby in Mount Moriah with grandparents <a href="Henry Collins">Henry Collins</a> and <a href="Catherine Hamilton">Catherine Hamilton</a> plus others of the Hamilton clan. He wedded again to the widow <a href="Almina H. Burks">Almina H. Burks</a>\* who brought into the marriage two sons Jesse M. and Clyde G. In 1908, she bore Albert a second daughter, Opal M. Hamilton. Sometime in the 1920s, Albert, Almina, and Opal moved to Nebraska City, Nebraska where Opal met Carl P. Snavely; they wed on April 17, 1929. Sometime later Opal and Carl relocated to Modesto, California.

Sad parallels run between Albert's and Esta's childhoods along with the lives of his parents <u>James</u> <u>Rile Hamilton</u> and <u>Fidelia Ann Gibson-Hamilton</u>. James married Fidelia sometime between 1868 and 1870. Family oral history coupled with vague documentation indicates that in 1872 Fidelia birthed twin boys Albert Dunn and John Wesley. Unfortunately, John Wesley did not survive being still born

or died soon after. Existing family members are not certain where he is buried but assume he is most likely in an unmarked grave in the Hamilton Cemetery. Currently, without the support of a death certificate, it is presumed and highly probable that Fidelia died at or shortly after childbirth. According to the 1880 census, we know that A. D. resided at his paternal grandparents (Henry Collins Hamilton and Catherine); although, his age is listed therein as 6, he was likely 8 as supported by other census data and his headstone with an1872 birth year. It is believed that he lived with these grandparents most of his childhood.

James Rile Hamilton died on March 13, 1921, from a stroke. He is buried at Matfield Green, Kansas. Source: https://www.wikitree.com/wiki/Hamilton-1803#Biography.

\*U. S. Census reports her last name and that of the boys as Burks. According to Margaret Cox-Russell, they are the wife and children of Joseph A. Banks who is buried in Morris City, Kansas.

#### John Butcher Gibson's Civil War Service

John Butcher Gibson enlisted as a volunteer in the service of the United States Army and joined at Modena, Mercer County, Missouri. He was enrolled and mustered into service on the same day of August 12, 1861, at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas as a member of Kansas 5th Cavalry, Company C Volunteers, for a period of three years. He was entered into service as a corporal. The Kansas Adjutant General's Report of the State of Kansas, Volume 1, 1861-1865, Leavenworth, Kansas by Bulletin Co-Operative Printing Company, Chicago, 1867, states he was promoted to Sergeant also on the day of his enlistment but his pension records do not reflect this rank but that of corporal.

These are the dates given for the births of the five Gibson children from the records of the pension application:

Mary E. Gibson was awarded a widow's pension by February 3, 1863, and the Number being 11,961 and her daughters also received a pension as heirs of their father, Number 29,319. Pensions were granted as an Act of Congress in 1862 for widows and minors to the age of 16.

#### Fidelia's Marriage to James Rile Hamilton and Death

The following are records sent to me (Margaret) by Al Kronenberger. They were written by his father, Albert Clay Kronenberger Sr. Albert Sr.'s mother was Julia E. Gibson (Fidelia's sister).

Fidelia Ann Gibson, the second child of John and Mary E. Stanley Gibson is recorded born April 29, 1853, in Iowa. She would expire from the pension roll April 28, 1869. Final settlement was made to her on October 14, 1868, where she is known as Fidelia Hamilton. On October 6, 1868, her guardian, Mr. Ballew, addressed her as Fidelia Gibson. Possibly she was married between October 6 and October 14, 1868, but surely in October of 1868. J. R. Hamilton who she had married signed the receipt for the final settlement of her monies. James Rile Hamilton was the oldest child of Henry Collins and Catherine Hickman Hamilton and was born December 1846 in Missouri.

**1870 United States Census**, Harrison County, Missouri Trail Creek Township, P.O. Cainsville, page 154:

Hamilton, James R. white 22 male head farmer Born: Mo Phidlelia A. white 16 female wife keeping house She can't read or write. James' parents are listed in the preceding household at 143-144.

Fidelia's life was short and her age, place and date of death are unknown. She is buried at the Hamilton Cemetery in Mercer County, Missouri. Her stone is broken at an angle and dates and

numbers are not readable because not all of the stone is there. One number looks to be the lower part of 2 though. Inscription:

Fidelia A.
Wife of J.R. Hamilton
Died A Little Flower of Love
That Blossomed But Died
Transplanted Now Above
To Bloom with God (unreadable)

#### **James Rile Hamilton Marries Mary Hannah Milner**

James R. Hamilton remarried February 5, 1874, in Mercer County, Missouri to Mary Hannah Milner, widow of Joseph Power. The Hamiltons moved to Chase County, Kansas where James died in 1921. I think they are buried at Matfield Green, Chase, KS.

<u>Archibald Hamilton</u> is listed as one of *Mercer County's earliest pioneers* (page 8) arriving in 1839. He is mentioned further on page 16:

Archibald Hamilton had been appointed postmaster and the office opened May 27, 1848. Mr. Hamilton was 62 years old at the time, a native Virginian who was one of the early settlers of Madison Township.

The Grove post office was located in a crossroads store on his property a mile or so north of the present site of the Hamilton Church. Miles Shannon, star route carrier on the post road between Princeton, Middlebury and Trenton, received orders to make a detour to a "western direction" to serve the new office.


The people of Madison Township found the new office a great convenience and were disappointed when it was abruptly discontinued August 5, 1850, only two years, two months and nine days after it had been established. The reasons for its short life are unknown. Perhaps Mr. Hamilton closed his store, or maybe there were not enough patrons to justify the expense.

However this may be, in its short life the Grove post office achieved a distinction which give it another line in history. It was the only stop between Princeton and Bethpage (later called Bethany) on the East-West post road established in the summer of 1847 extending from the Mississippi River on the east to the Missouri River on the west.

#### Personal Experiences of Donna Shipley-Zaiger and Elmer as told to Kathy Wright-Wainer

Yes, I actually knew Elmer and his sister Priscilla. They were 1st cousins to Albert. They were the children of Ellen and Henry Collins, Jr. who was known as Uncle Wig. How interesting that your grandma ended up with Elmer's 1952 fishing license. Actually, it is amazing Elmer would have even bothered to get a license. Perhaps he was going fishing someplace other than down on the river bottom' of the Hamilton land. He was in WW I, came back home to the farm, never married, drove an old Model A or T up to Mt. Moriah just about every day. As he'd come by my Grandma Ollie and Grandpa Joe's place chugging and clanging, we knew it was Elmer! He'd always wave but seldom stop.

# Alfred and Nellie Hamilton

Alfred L. was born 1855, son of Henry C. and Catherine (Hickman) Hamilton. He married Nellie Ball, she was born May 6, 1862, daughter of John M. born Dec. 9, 1828 and Luccetta (Hartsborn) Ball born Feb. 2, 1830.

Nellie was one of eight children Elvira (Ball) Chestnut, born Aug. 30, 1851, Henry Ball born Dec. 15, 1853, Leslic Ball born Oct. 14, 1855, Fanny A. Ball, born Aug. 1, 1858, William J. Ball born Feb. 28, 1867, Emma Ball born Sept. 8, 1869 married William Everett April 17, 1891. Edward "Ned" Ball born June Hartshern

12, 1871.

"Al" was a farmer and stock raiser, owned a farm South and East of Mt. Moriah. They had four daughters, Lesta L., born March 10, 1882, died 1959, Lettie born Sept. 21, 1883, died Jan. 17, 1965, Bessie C. born March 7, 1885, died Dec. 10, 1965, and Ollie, born Sept. 27, 1888.

Bessie and Ollie taught school. Out of the four daughters, Ollie was the only one to marry. Lesta and Lettie made their home on the farm after their parent's passed on. Bessie lived both on the farm and at Bethany. After the death of Lesta, Lettie moved to Bethany to be with Bessie.

Alfred died 1945, Nellie 1943, Alfred, Nellie, Ollie, Lesta L., and Bessie C. are buried at Sharon Chapel Cemetery, South of Mt. Moriah. Lettic C. is buried at Goshen Cemetery East of Mt. Moriah beside the Young Fellow, she was to marry. He died when he was but twenty onc.

### Archibald and Susannah Hamilton

Archibald Hamilton was born in Monogolia County, West Virginia in 126, son of Henry and Elizabeth Hamilton. He married Susannah Miller, granddaughter of Jacob Miller (who was killed by the Indians in 1778 near Dorsey's Knob). Susannah was born in Virginia in 1792.

Archibald and Susannah left Virginia about 1832. They lived in Indiana a few years, then came on to Missouri in 1839. They homesteaded on the farm south east of Mt. Moriah, where Mrs. Joe Hamilton now lives, just north of the Hamilton Cemetery. When Archibald first settled here his closest neighbor lived in the area that is now Lake Pahoe. Twice a year he made a trip to Lexington, Missouri with wagon and team of oxen to buy supplies. In the spring he took a load of furs that were caught during the winter to sell, so he could buy supplies; then in the fall he took bee's wax to sell or trade for supplies to last through the winter months.

Archibald gave the land for the Hamilton Cemetery in 1852. Later his son, Jacob R., who then lived on the old homestead, gave the land on which the Hamilton School was built and in 1905 gave the land for the Hamilton Church to be build on. Archibald died on October 13, 1855. Susannah died on April 28, 1874. They are buried in the Hamilton Cemetery.

Children of Archibald and Susannah were;

Mahala, born in 1813 in Virginia, died on November 12, 1852, oldest marked grave in Hamilton Cemetery.

Elizabeth, born in 1819 in Virginia, died on August 20,

Henry Collins, born in 1822 in Virginia, died on February 11, 1890. James G. 1824 .

Susan, born 1829 in Virginia.

Archibald Gullie, born 1831 in Virginia. Jacob R. born on December 13, 1834 in Indiana, died on March 28, 1915. His wife was Jane A., she was born on February 4, 1842, died on September 11, 1923.

Rely, born 1844 in Mercer County, Missouri.

# Archibald Gullie and Elizabeth Hamilton

Archibald Gullie "Young Arch" as he was called, was born on September 1, 1831 in Virginia. He came to Missouri with his parents, Archibald and Susanna in the year of 1839.

He married Elizabeth Earixson in 1852, Elizabeth was born on October 27, 1833, died on November 22, 1883. Young Arch died on February 4, 1902.

Children of Archibald Gullie and Elizabeth were;

Samuel Relighie "Rol", was born on February 28, 1854, died in 1919, he married Eva J. Miller, Eva was born in 1854, died in 1887.

Sophronia C. was born on May 21, 1856, died on September 25, 1857.

Susannah, was born on April 13, 1858, died in 1944, she married C. M. Milner.

Rebecca was born on October 11, 1860, died on March 11, 1893, she married Millar F. Nigh.

John Earixson "Toud" was born on July 19, 1863, died in 1939, he married Lillie Mae Clark.

Thomas Murray, was born on November 5, 1865, died in 1930, he married Millie Gray. Millie was born in 1868, died in 1962. They were the parents of Eula (Hamilton) Hubbard, and Wayne Hamilton.

James Buclmer was born on November 13, 1868, died in 1928, he married Hettie D. Mullins.

Mason Fleming "Mace", was born on August 1, 1871, died on April 5, 1948, he married Nora Bell Power, Nora was born on September 22, 1875, died on May 13, 1950.

William Haden "Hade" was born on September 1, 1876, died on March 20, 1956, he married Ollie M. Lawrence, Ollie was born on October 28, 1878, died on January 10, 1970.

Archibald Cullie, Elizabeth, children, and their spouses are buried in the Hamilton Cemetery.

### Garrett and Mary Hamilton

Garrett was born October 20, 1857 in Mercer Co., son of Jacob Riley and Sarah (Maupin) Hamilton.

Garrett was married June 20, 1879 to Mary Ann Wells who was born February 18, 1863 in Mercer Co.

They were the parents of nine children:

Auie born April 6, 1880; George born June 20, 1882; Pearl born March 27, 1884; Edna born November 21, 1886; Gussie born February 17, 1887; Ruby born July 3, 1892; Ray born December 25, 1889; Elma born February 28, 1896; and Bonnie born August 29, 1899.

Garrett died June 1915 and Mary Ann died June 26, 1933.

# Henry and Elizabeth Hamilton

Henry was born in 1742 in Ireland, died on August 27, 1828. He married Elizabeth Fry (or Friand). She died on September 18, 1833.

They are buried in the Fairview Cemetry, four miles from Morgantown, West Virginia on Graston Road. Both have tombstones.

Henry served in Captain Peter Grant's Company, Col. Garyson's Regiment of the Virginia Line during the Revolutionary War.

In a sketch of the Hamilton Family in Biographical and Portrait Cyclopedias of Monongalia, Marion, and Taylor Counties, West Virginia is found this statement:

Four brothers, John, Henry, Archibald, and James came from Ireland, before the beginning of the Revolutionary War, to seek homes in the "New World". John settled in Kentucky, Henry in Monongalia County, Virginia (now West Virginia), Archibald made his home near Waynesburg, Green County, Pennsylvania, and James went to Cincinnati, Ohio.

Children of Henry and Elizabeth were;

Henry Jr. was married in 1820 to Ann Smith, daughter of Walter Smith.

Christiana was married to Joseph Brenner, Jr., son of Joseph Brenner, Sr. who was a Revolutionary War Soldier.

Rebecca was born in 1797, died in 1848, was married in 1817 to William Gray, Jr.

# Henry Collins and Catherine Hamilton

Henry Collins Hamilton was born June 10, 1822 in Monongahela, Co., Virginia.

Henry was united in marriage to H. Catherine Hickman on November 16, 1845. Catherine was born April 15, 1826 and died August 26, 1902. He was among the first settlers in Harrison Co., Missouri, in the year 1845.

Henry lived on the same farm south of Mt. Moriah till his death on February 11, 1890. He had been out in the timber chopping wood, was returning to the house stopped by the saw mill near his residence, and while chatting freely with his neighbors, suffered a stroke and fell into the arms of Esq. Springer, he never spoke and only drew a few breaths. Henry and Catherine are buried at the Hamilton Cemetery.

Henry and Catherine had eleven children:

James Rile was married to H. Milner. Had children.

M. Archibald was born in Harrison County on January 6, 1849, died February 19, 1914 from a leakage of the heart and Dropsy. Buried at Hamilton Cemetery. He married A. Margareta Vanderpool on April 25, 1869. She was born October 10, 1849, died September 2, 1935. They had five children: Lucy B., Nancy C., Henry M., Adrew Lee, and Amanda E., "called Dolly," Dolly died November 4, 1890. She was 16 years old.

Sarah Ann called "Sallie and Sis" was born December 27, 1850, died July 27, 1934, had been a invalid the last four years. She married Osker J. Clinkenbeard, he was born May 14, 1849, died October 10, 1937.

Children Leola "Bertie" married Leggett and Oren L. Clinkenbeard. Buried at Miriam Cemetery in Bethany, MO.

Alfred L. born 1855, he married Nellie Ball.





#### HENRY HAMILTON'S SERVICE RECORD

In June 1775, the Second Continental Congress appointed George Washington as general and commander in chief of the current and future forces raised in the defense of American liberty. The fighting forces of the patriots consisted of militiamen and volunteers. The Battles of Lexington, Concord, and Bunker Hill had already occurred before Washington assumed command in July of 1775 and began to reorganize the army. The Continental Army reached peak strength of 20,000 men by the end of the war. The Treaty of Paris in 1783 ended the war of independence. The American losses ranged from about 4,000 to 25,000 casualties.

Our fifth generation grandparent, Henry Hamilton, was born in Ireland in 1742, and arrived in Baltimore, Maryland in 1764. He settled in the town of Winchester, Frederick County, Virginia. After July 4, 1776, the Second Continental Congress declared our independence from Great Britain. Congress authorized the reorganization and enlargement of the Continental Army. Colonel William Grayson was ordered to recruit a regiment for the Continental Army known as Grayson's Regiment or 11th Virginia's Foot or Virginia line. Virginia required all free white males aged 16 to 50 to serve in a militia company unless exempted. Henry Hamilton volunteered for the newly organized Virginia Foot Regiment on September 2, 1777, consisting of four companies from four Virginia counties. Henry was assigned to the company that Captain Peter Grant commanded. He signed a three-year commitment to the regiment. Colonel Grayson commanded the regiment through the Philadelphia campaign. In 1779, Grayson resigned his commission to serve on the Congressional Board of War and later became the first U.S. senator from Virginia serving from 1789 until his death on March 12, 1790.

The volunteers from Frederick County were later transferred to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Virginia Brigade of the main army under George Washington. His regiment took part in the defense of Philadelphia, the capitol of the colonies, in the Battles of Brandywine Creek and Germantown. The British captured Philadelphia and the capitol was moved to Lancaster, Pennsylvania. From December 1777 until March of 1778, Washington set up camp in Valley Forge, Pennsylvania. At Valley Forge, Baron Von Steuben taught the American Army how to fight in a professional manner and transformed the troops into a disciplined army which gave them new spirit and confidence.

In February 1778, France signed an alliance with American colonies to help with their fight for independence from Britain. The British evacuated Philadelphia and moved back toward New York and the American army followed attacking at Monmouth. In June of 1778, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Virginia Brigade took part in the Battle of Monmouth Court House, New Jersey. The American army had a technical victory. Later, Henry's unit was reassigned to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Virginia Brigade. Winter quarters were spent in Middlebrook, New Jersey from November 1778 to June 1779. In 1779, they were reorganized in the 7<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment. In December 1779, the 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment was assigned to the southern department for the defense of Charleston. Henry's three-year enlistment ended in September 1780, thus his commitment was fulfilled. The 7<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment was moved to protect the city of Charleston, South Carolina after Henry's discharge. The British captured Charleston and his former regiment was forced to surrender to the British.

Henry returned to Winchester and married Elizabeth Fry Tyrand. They were blessed with four boys and three girls. Their first son, James, was our direct ancestor and he fought in the second war for independence, the War of 1812. In 1790, Henry moved his family from Winchester about 100 miles west to Fairview near Morgantown, Virginia. After the war soldiers who had served at least three years could collect a pension and get a land grant. (I was unable to find proof that Henry took advantage of these benefits.) Henry Sr. died August 28, 1828, at age 86. He and his wife are buried in Fairview Cemetery 5 miles south of Morgantown.

James Hamilton served as a corporal in Capt Samuel Kennedy's Company in Colonel A. Woods' Regiment during the War of 1812.
